ORDER

- 1 In this Order,
 - (a) "former area of Lavoy" means the area of Lavoy before its dissolution;
 - (b) "Lavoy" means the Village of Lavoy; and
 - (c) "receiving municipality" means the County of Minburn No. 27.
- The former area of Lavoy is part of ward five of the receiving municipality until the receiving municipality passes a bylaw pursuant to section 148 of the Municipal Government Act that provides otherwise.
- All assets, liabilities, whether arising from under a debenture or otherwise, rights, duties, functions and obligations of Lavoy are vested in the receiving municipality and may be dealt with in the name of the receiving municipality.
- Bylaws and resolutions of Lavoy continue to apply within the former area of Lavoy until the bylaws or resolutions are repealed, amended or replaced by the council of the receiving municipality.
- A reference to Lavoy in any order, regulation, bylaw, certificate of title, agreement or any other instrument is deemed to be a reference to the receiving municipality.
- 6 (1) The receiving municipality must take
 - (a) money received from Lavoy at its dissolution, and
 - (b) if the receiving municipality sells, on or before December 31, 2001, any of the assets vested in it under section 3, money received from the sale of those assets,

and deposit it in a reserve fund established by the receiving municipality.

- (2) The amounts referred to in subsection (1) in the reserve fund may only be used
 - (a) to pay or reduce any liability transferred to the receiving municipality from Lavoy at its dissolution,
 - (b) for projects within the former area of Lavoy, or
 - (c) for operational expenditures in the former area of Lavoy incurred in 1999.
- 7 (1) The employment of the employees of Lavoy is terminated when Lavoy dissolves.
 - (2) Nothing in subsection (1) affects the receiving municipality's responsibility with regard to any liability that may arise from the termination of employment of employees of Lavoy.
- The Minister may decide any matter with respect to the division or apportionment of the property, rights, assets and liabilities resulting from the dissolution of Lavoy.
