

## THE SPECIAL AREAS ACT, 1939

---

### CERTAIN PROVINCIAL LANDS WITHDRAWN FROM THE TILLEY EAST SPECIAL AREA AND ADDED TO THE SOUNDING CREEK-NEUTRAL HILLS SPECIAL AREA

Edmonton, Wednesday, July 2, 1941.

The Honourable the Administrator, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to order (pursuant to the provisions of The Special Areas Act, 1939, being Chapter 34 of the Statutes of Alberta, 1939), that the lands hereinafter set forth, be, and they are hereby withdrawn from The Tilley East Special Area and added to The Sounding Creek-Neutral Hills Special Area.

#### *Description:*

All that parcel or tract of land, situate, lying, and being in the Province of Alberta, Dominion of Canada, more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the intersection of the left bank of the South Saskatchewan River with the east boundary of the south-east quarter of Section 1 in Township 22, Range 1; thence in a generally south-westerly direction up-stream along the said left bank of the South Saskatchewan River to the east boundary of the south-east quarter of Section 24 in Township 19, Range 3; thence northerly along the road allowance between Ranges 2 and 3 to the north-east corner of Section 13 in Township 20, Range 3; thence westerly along the north boundaries of the south halves of Townships 20 to the intersection with the road allowance between Ranges 10 and 11; thence northerly along the said road allowance between Ranges 10 and 11 to its intersection with the left bank of the Red Deer River; thence in a generally easterly direction along the said left bank of the Red Deer River to its intersection with the Fourth Meridian; thence southerly along the said Fourth Meridian to the point of commencement; all west of the Fourth Meridian.

Reserving thereout and therefrom all mines and minerals.
