

ESTABLISHMENT OF TOWN MUNICIPALITY.

Edmonton, Monday, October 16, 1911

Under the provisions of The Municipal Amendment Ordinance, 1901, Honour the Lieutenant Governor has been pleased to proclaim that on and after the Nineteenth day of September, 1911, the Village of Athabasca Landing be erected into a town municipality, to be known as the Town of Athabasca Landing; that the area of the said Town of Athabasca Landing consist of the following lands The Hudson's Bay Company's Reserve, River Lots One, Two and Three West, River Lots One and Two East, all of Sections 20 and 21 lying north of the Athabasca River, and all of Sections 16, 17, 20 and 21 lying south of the Athabasca River, all in Township 66 in Range 22 west of the Fourth Meridian, together with all road allowances and public roads lying within or adjoining the above described land; that C. E. Nancekivill, of Athabasca Landing, be named as the Returning Officer for the holding of the first election of Mayor and Councillors of the said town.
