

R E G I N A, THURSDAY, MAY 18, 1905.

Upon the recommendation of the Commissioner of Public Works, dated May 17, 1905, all the requirements of The Village Ordinance with respect to the establishment of villages having been complied with, the Executive Council advises that, under the provisions of The Village Ordinance in that behalf, the area bounded on the north by the Athabasca River, on the west by the east boundary of West River Lot No. 2, on the south by the south boundary of West River Lot No. 1 and the south boundary of the Hudson's Bay Reserve, and on the east by the east boundary of the Hudson's Bay Reserve to the intersection of the To-wat-i-naw River and by the said To-wat-i-naw River to its junction with the Athabasca River be established as a village under the name of Athabasca

Landing; that Monday the Fifth day of June, 1905, be the day fixed for the election of an Overseer of the said Village; and that Alfred J. Romeril, of Athabasca Landing, Alberta, be appointed to act as Returning Officer at the said election.

The Lieutenant Governor in Council.

The undersigned has the honour to report that, having received satisfactory proof that the area mentioned hereunder is not included within any incorporated City, Town or rural Municipality and that the said area contains not less than fifteen occupied dwelling houses, he has, in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of The Village Ordinance, caused notices to be posted in three conspicuous places, one of which was the Post Office, within the said area announcing the intention to establish the area as a Village after the expiration of thirty days from the date of the posting of the said notices :

He further reports that such notices were posted at least thirty days prior to the date hereof :

The undersigned therefore begs to recommend that, under the provisions of Section 4 of The Village Ordinance, an area bounded on the North by the Athabasca River, on the West by the East boundary of West River Lot No.2, on the South by the South boundary of West River Lot No.1 and the South boundary of the Hudson's Bay Reserve, and on the East by the East boundary of the Hudson's Bay Reserve to the intersection of the To-wat-i-naw River and by the said To-wat-i-naw River to its junction with the Athabasca River be established as a Village; that the Village be given the name of ATHABASCA LANDING ; that Alfred J. Romeril, of Athabasca Landing, Alberta, be

appointed Returning Officer to act at the election of an Overseer for the said Village; and that the said election for an Overseer for the Village in question be held on Monday the Fifth day of June, 1905.
