The Honourable the Attorney General reports, under date of June 27th, that he has had under consideration the petition of the Council of the Village of Castor for the erection of the said Village into a town municipality under the provisions of The Municipal Amendment Ordinance, 1901;

The Minister further reports that satisfactory proof of the preliminary acts and requirements requisite to the erection of the said Village into a town has been furnished;

The Executive Council therefore advise, upon the recommendation of the Hon. the Attorney General that Your Honour's Proclamation do issue, proclaiming that on and after the 27th day of June, 1910, the said Village of Castor be erected into a town municipality to be known as the Town of Castor, and that the area of the said Town of Castor consist of all of the South half of the North-west quarter of Section 35; all of the South-west quarter of Section 35; all of the South-east quarter of Section 34; the East half of the North-east quarter of Section 27, and the North half of the North-west quarter of Section 26, all in Township 37, Range 14, West of the 4th Meridian, which said lands contain 560 acres, more or less; also all road allowances within the above described area.

The Executive Council further advise that George Auxier, of Castor, Alberta, be named as the Returning Officer for the holding of the first election of Mayor and Councillors for the said Town.

The Lieutenant Governor in Council:

The Undersigned has the honour to report that he has had under consideration the petition of the Council of the Village of Castor for the erection of the said village into a town municipality under the provisions of The Municipal Amendment Ordinance, 1901;

The undersigned further reports that satisfactory proof of the preliminary acts and requirements requisite to the erection of the said village into a town has been furnished;

The undersigned therefore recommends that Your Honour's Proclamation do issue proclaiming that on and after the twenty-seventh day of June, 1910, the said village of Castor be erected into a town municipality to be known as the TOWN OF CASTOR, and that the area of the said town of Castor consist of ALL of the south half of the north-west quarter of section thirty-five, (35); all of the south-west quarter of section thirty-five, (35); all of the south-east quarter of section thirty-four, (34); the east half of the north-east quarter of section twenty-seven, (27) and the north half of the north-west quarter of section twenty-six, (26), all in Township thirty-seven, (37) Range Fourteen, (14), West of the Fourth Meridian, which said lands contain an area of Five hundred and sixty acres, (560) more or less; also all road allowances within the

above described area;

The undersigned further recommends that GEORGE
AUXIER, of Castor, Alberta, be named as the Returning
Officer for the holding of the first election of Mayor
and Councillors for the said Town.
