TOWN OF CROSSFIELD

In township 28, range 1

Firstly, the east one-half of section 26 excepting thereout road plan 741 0378

Secondly, all of the south-east quarter of section 35 lying westerly of the westerly limit of the C and E Railway Plan R Y 9

Thirdly, all that portion of the north-east quarter of section 23 which lies east of the easterly boundaries of the railway's right-of-way as shown on the C and E Railway Plan R Y 9 and 5287 JK excepting thereout road plan 741 0378

Fourthly, all that portion of the east-west government road allowance adjoining the south boundary of the south-east quarter of section 26 which lies west of the production north and south across the said road allowance of the westerly limit of road plan 741 0378

Fifthly, all that portion of the north-west quarter of section 25 and all that portion of the south-west quarter of section 36 required for road plan filed in the Land Titles Office for the South Alberta Land Registration District as No 2595-Q

All of the above described lands lying west of the fifth meridian
