The Executive Council has had under consideration the report of the Honourable the Minister of Public Works, dated December 30th 1909, stating that having received satisfactory proof that the area mentioned hereunder is not contained within any incorporated city or rural municipality, and that the said area contains not less than 25 occupied dwelling houses, he has in accordance with the provisions of section 3 of the Village Act caused Notices to be posted in three conspicuous places within the said area, one of which was the Post Office, announcing the intention to establish the area at the expiration of thirty days from the date of posting such notices.

The Minister further reports that such notices were posted at least thirty days prior to the date hereof.

Upon consideration of the foregoing report and on the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Public Works the Executive Council advise, under the provisions of Section 4 of the Village Act, that the south half of section 17 and the south east quarter of section 18 in township 39, range 2 West of the Fourth Meridian be established a Village; that the Village be given the name of P R O V O S T; that Nicholas Arthur Kilburn of Provost, be Returning Officer for the purpose of acting at the election of the first council of the Village, and that the meeting for nomination of candidates for the office of Councillor shall be held on Monday the 24th day of January 1910.

THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

The undersigned has the honor to report that having received satisfactory proof that the area mentioned hereunder is not contained within any incorporated City of Rural Municipality, and that the said area contains not less than twenty-five (25) occupied dwelling houses, he has, in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of the Village Act caused Notices to be posted in three conspicuous places within the said area, one of which was the Post-Office, announcing the intention to establish the area at the expiration of Thirty days from the date of posting such Notices.

He further reports that such Notices were posted at least thirty days prior to the date hereof.

The undersigned therefore begs to recommend that under the provisions of Section 4 of the Village Act the south-half of section seventeen (17) and the south-east quarter of Section eighteen (18) in Township Thirty-nine (39) Range Two (2) West of the Fourth Meridian be established a Village; that the Village be given the name of P R O V O S T; that Mr. Nicholas Arthur Kilburn of Provost, Alberta, be Returning Officer for the purpose of acting at the election of the first council of the Village, and that the meeting for nomination of candidates for the office of Councillor shall be held on Monday the 24th., day of January, 1910.
