EDMONTON, Thursday, March 14th 1907.

The Executive Council has had under consideration the report of the Honorable the Minister of Public Works, dated March 7th 1907, wherein he states that satisfactory proof has been received that the area mentioned hereunder is not contained within any incorporated city, town or rural municipality; that the said area contains not less than fifteen occupied dwelling houses, and in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of The Village Ordinance he has caused notices to be posted in three conspicuous places within the said area, one of which was the Post Office, announcing the intention to establish the area as a Village after the expiration of thirty days from the date of posting such notices. The Minister further reports that such notices were posted at least thirty days prior to the date hereof.

Upon consideration of the foregoing report and on the recommendation of the Honorable the Minister of Public Works the Executive Council advises that under the provisions of Section 4 of The Village Ordinance, the North West quarter of Section twenty-five (25) and South West quarter of Section thirty-six (36), Township fifty-two (52) Range twenty-eight (28) West of the Fourth Meridian; the North-East quarter of Section twenty-five (25) and South-East quarter of Section thirty-six (36) Township fifty-two (52) Range one (1) West of the Fifth Meridian

be established a Village; that the Village be given the name of STONY PLAIN; that John H. Foerster of Stony Plain be Returning Officer for the purpose of acting at the election of the First Overseer for the Village, and that the said election for an Overseer for the Village in question be held on Monday the twenty-fifth day of March 1907.
