The Executive Council has had under consideration the report of the Honourable the Minister of Public Works, dated March 19th 1908, setting forth that satisfactory proof having been received that the area mentioned hereunder is not contained within any incorporated city, town or rural municipality, and that the said area contains not less than twenty five occupied dwelling houses, in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of The Village Act notices have been caused to be posted in three conspicuous places within the said area, one of which was the Post Office, announcing the intention to establish the area as a Village at the expiration of thirty days from the date of posting such notices. The Minister further reports that such notices were posted at least thirty days prior to the date hereof.

Upon consideration of the foregoing report and on the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Public Works the Executive Council advise, under the provisions of Section 4 of The Village Act, the South West quarter of Section 14, township 24, range 25 West of the Fourth Meridian, and that part of the North West quarter of Section 14, township 24, range 25 West of the Fourth Meridian, lying South West of the Main Line of the Canadian Pacific Railway be established a Village; that the Village be given the name of

Strathmore; that William Ellis Brown of Strathmore be Returning Officer for the purpose of acting at the election of the first Council of the Village, and that the said election for a Council for the Village in question be held on Monday the 6th day of April 1908.
