WHEREAS the Council of the Village of Wembley has, by resolution, made a request to have the village formed into a town and has furnished satisfactory proof that the requirements requisite to the formation of a town have been complied with:

THEREFORE, upon the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Municipal Affairs, the Lieutenant Governor in Council, pursuant to section 14(1)(d) of The Municipal Government Act, orders that the Village of Wembley be formed into the TOWN OF WEMBLEY, effective August 1, 1980, to consist of the lands described in the attached Appendix.

APPENDIX "A"

TOWN OF WEMBLEY

In township 71, range 8.

Firstly, the north half of section 15

Secondly, the south-east quarter of section 22.

Thirdly, that part of the south-west quarter of section 22 lying south of the northerly boundary of the right-of-way and station grounds of the Edmonton, Dunvegan and British Columbia Railway, as same are shown on a plan registered in the Land Titles Office, Edmonton, as Plan No. 2953 CL.

All of the north-south government road allowance adjoining the west boundary of the north-west quarter of section 15 and that portion of the north-south government road allowance adjoining the south-west quarter of section 22 lying south of the westerly projection of the northerly boundary of the right-of-way and station grounds of the Edmonton, Dunvegan and British Columbia Railway.

All of the above described lands lying west of the sixth meridian.

Reserving thereout all mines and minerals.
