The Executive has had under consideration the report of the Acting Minister of Public Works, dated April 25th, and beg to advise that having received satisfactory proof that the area mentioned hereunder is not contained within any incorporated City Town or Rural Municipality, and that the said area contains not less than twenty-five occupied dwelling houses, he has, in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of the Village Act, caused notices to be posted in three conspicuous places within the said area, one of which was the Post Office, announcing the intention to establish the area as a Village at the expiration of thirty days from the date of posting of such notices.

The Minister further reports that such notices were posted at least thirty days prior to the date hereof.

Upon consideration of the foregoing report and upon the recommendation of the Hon. the Acting Minister of Public Works, the Executive Council advise that under the provisions of Section 4 of the Village Act, that portion of the east half of Section Sixteen (16) Township Twelve (12) Range Twenty-Three (23) west of the fourth Meridian, that has been subdivided and registered in the Southern Alberta Land Titles Office as Plan No. 2605 X, be established as a Village; that the village be given the name of BARONS; That Mr. J. W. Brainard of Barons, Alberta, be Returning Officer for the purpose of acting at the election of the first Council of the Village; and that the said election for a Council

for the Village in question be held on Tuesday the Seventeenth day of May, 1910.
