


  
Lieutenant Governor.

Edmonton, Wednesday, March 22nd, 1911.

The Hon. the Minister of Public Works reports under date of March 17th, that having received satisfactory proof that the area mentioned hereunder is not contained within any incorporated City, Town or Rural Municipality and that the said area contains not less than twenty-five (25) occupied dwelling houses, he has, in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of the Village Act caused Notices to be posted in three conspicuous places within the said area, one of which was the Post-Office announcing the intention to establish the area at the expiration of thirty days from the date of posting such notices.

The Hon. Minister further reports that such Notices were posted at least thirty days prior to the date hereof.

The Executive Council therefore advise, upon the recommendation of the Hon. the Minister of Public Works, that under the provisions of Section 4 of the Village Act, legal subdivisions two (2) and three (3), six (6) and seven (7) in section twenty-six (26) township fifty (50) range three (3) West of the Fourth Meridian be established a Village; that the village be given the name of Kitscoty; that Mr. J. H. Drew, of Kitscoty, Alberta, be Returning Officer for the purpose of acting at the election of the first council of the Village and that the meeting for nomination of candidates for the office of Councillor shall be held on Thursday, March the Thirtieth, 1911.
