
Edmonton, Tuesday, November 7th, 1911

The Hon. the Minister of Public Works reports, under date of October 19th, 1911, that having received satisfactory proof that the area mentioned hereunder is not contained within any incorporated city, town or rural municipality, and that the said area contains not less than twenty-five (25) occupied dwelling houses, he has, in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of the Village Act, caused notices to be posted in three conspicuous places within the said area, one of which was the Post Office, announcing the intention to establish the area at the expiration of thirty days from the date of posting such notices.

The Hon. the Minister of Public Works further reports that such Notices were posted at least thirty days prior to the date hereof.

Therefore, upon the recommendation of the Hon. the Minister of Public Works, the Executive Council advise that under the provisions of Section 4 of the Village Act the South half of Section thirty-three (33), Township forty-three (43), Range Eleven (11), West of the Fourth Meridian, be

established a Village; that the village be given the name of L O U G H E E D; that Mr. Hugh Lester Gray, of Lougheed, Alberta, be Returning Officer for the purpose of acting at the election of the first Council of the village, and that the meeting for nomination of candidates for the office of Councillor shall be held on Tuesday, the thirty-first day of October, 1911.
