

Edmonton, Saturday, April 2nd 1910

The Executive Council has had under consideration the report of the Honourable the Acting Minister of Public Works, dated March 30th 1910, stating that satisfactory proof has been received that the area mentioned hereunder is not contained within any incorporated city, town or rural municipality, and that the said area contains not less than twenty-five occupied dwelling houses, therefore, in accordance with the provisions of section 3 of the Village Act Notices have been posted in three conspicuous places within the said area, one of which was the Post Office, announcing the intention to establish the area as a Village after the expiration of thirty days from the date of posting such notices.

The Minister further reports that such notices were posted **at least** thirty days prior to the date hereof.

Upon consideration of the foregoing report and on the recommendation of the Honourable the Acting Minister of Public Works the Executive Council advise, under the provisions of section 4 of the Village Act, that the east half of the north west quarter of section 4, the west half of the north east quarter of section 4, legal subdivisions 6 and 7 of section 4, township 50 range 17 West of the Fourth Meridian, be established a Village; that the Village be given the name of Ryley; that Francis Harry Garvey of Ryley, Alberta, be Returning Officer for the purpose of acting at the election of the first Council of the Village; and that the meeting for the nomination of candidates for the office of Coun-

Councillor shall be held on Thursday the 28th day of April

THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

The undersigned has the honor to report that having received satisfactory proof that the area mentioned hereunder is not contained within any incorporated City, Town or Rural Municipality, and that the said area contains not less than twenty-five occupied dwelling houses, he has, in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of the Village Act caused Notices to be posted in three conspicuous places within the said area, one of which was the Post-Office, announcing the intention to establish the area as a Village after the expiration of Thirty days from the date of posting such Notices.

He further reports that such Notices were posted at least thirty days prior to the date hereof.

The undersigned therefore begs to recommend that under the provisions of Section 4 of the Village Act, the east-half of the north-west quarter of Section Four (4), west-half of the north-east quarter of Section Four (4), legal subdivisions six (6) and seven (7) of Section four (4), Township fifty (50) range seventeen (17) West of the Fourth Meridian, be established a Village; that the Village be given the name of R Y L E Y ; that Mr. Francis Harry Garvey of Ryley, Alberta, be Returning Officer for the purpose of acting at the election of the first Council of the Village; and that the meeting for the nomination of candidates for the office of Councillor shall be held on Thursday, the twenty-eighth day of April, 1910.
